City Hall Entrance to be Closed

The front entrance to Union City Hall will be closed for the month of March to complete necessary renovations and repairs to the front steps.

The current concrete steps are crumbling and need to be replaced. Plans include new steps, a new 5-footwide handicap ramp, more handrails and a "snow melt system" that will make the steps and ramps safer.

While the entrance is closed, those visiting City Hall should enter on the west side at the corner of Linden and E. Locust Street. It is 6 steps up to the main floor.

Those unable to use the stairs should enter through the basement on the east side of the building, just off the parking lot. City staff will be available in the lower level to assist with water bill payments, however, anyone needing help accessing the building is encouraged to call City Hall at 636-583-3600 to make arrangements for assistance.



2014 has come and gone, and what a year it was for the City! The City Auditorium upgrades continued with the addition of a new heating and air conditioning system and for the first time in its history the Auditorium now has air conditioning. This should be a great asset for those who want to hold wedding receptions, family reunions, and other events during the summer months. The final design work was also completed for the improvements to Prairie Dell Road and the Phase One im-



provements to Denmark Road were completed. The City added Well Number 7, which supports and secures our water supply for the eastern portion of the City. The City also acquired a much needed maintenance building on the east side of the City to support public works services and Veterans Memorial Park. As the year ended, the City was able to complete the financial planning for the construction of Veterans Memorial Park in 2015 without an increase in taxes.

Joey Graves, Community Development Director, decided to pursue his dreams and left the City in July of 2014. He will be missed and I wish him well. Before his departure, he completed working with Pharma-tech to complete an expansion project that will result in an expansion of business and additional job opportunities. Wanda Parsons and Russell Rost picked up the reins and were able to bring to fruition two additional projects. Epicure LLC (Volpi Foods) and Earle M. Jorgensen Company have purchased property in the Union Corporate Center. These projects will increase industrial business activity in Union and will also provide additional job opportunities in the near future. Wanda and Russell continue working on other new projects and assisting some of our existing businesses with expansion planning.

Looking forward to 2015 I don't see a let up in activity, if anything we will quicken the pace considerably. In January 2015, James Schmieder joined the City as Assistant City Administrator with Community Development responsibilities. The selection process was long and we had several good candidates that made the selection difficult. I believe James brings a great background in public service and administration that will prove to be an asset for the City. We will also see the construction of the improvements to Prairie Dell Road and the long awaited construction of Veterans Memorial Park. Prairie Dell Road Improvements

Construction will begin in March along Prairie Dell Road. The design includes widening of Prairie Dell Road from Denmark Road to Prairie Dell Plaza Drive to incorporate landscape islands, 8' concrete sidewalks and new street lights along the roadway. Improvements will also include the City's third roundabout at the entrance to East Central College.

During construction, southbound Prairie Dell Road traffic will remain open, however the Denmark Road entrance will be closed. Northbound Prairie Dell Road traffic will also be closed. Progress Parkway can be used to access US Highway 50 and the businesses located on Denmark Road.

Electronic Recycling & Food Pantry Collection

In a continuing effort to reduce the amount of solid waste from entering landfills and to provide our community with opportunities to participate in recycling, the City of Union is happy to announce its next electronic recycling event. The next event will be on Saturday, May 16, 2015 from 8:00 am until 1:00 pm at the Street Department Shed, 202 West Brown Street.

- WHAT CAN YOU BRING? Computers, Printers, Keyboards, Laptops, Hard Drives, Cell Phones, Pagers, Radios, Scanners, Speakers, VCR's, DVD's, Fax Machines, Answering Machines, Stereos, Furnaces, Water Heaters, Air Conditioners, Microwaves, Power Tools, Kitchen Appliances. There is no charge for these items. If you have an unusual electronic item, please call City Hall at 636-583-3600 and we will determine if Midwest Recycling will take the item.
- WHAT ELSE WILL THEY TAKE? At no charge Lawn and garden equipment, but must have gas and oil
 removed AND flat panel TVs (plasma, LCD, LED).
 There is a \$20 fee per CRT TV 27" or smaller, or \$40
 fee for console, rear projection and CRT TVs larger than
 27". This is a necessary change due to the loss of a
 grant that was in affect at past events.
- WHAT WON'T BE ACCEPTED? Smoke detectors, glass lamps, light bulbs, fluorescent tubes.
- DO I HAVE TO BE A UNION RESIDENT? No, everyone is welcome to participate.

- DO I HAVE TO BRING HELP TO UNLOAD?
 No, Midwest Recycling will have employees unload your vehicle for you.
- HOW CAN I HELP WITH THIS EVENT? Although there are no charges for most of the items, the City has used these events to collect non-perishable items and cash for the Union Food Pantry to help with their great cause. To date, the seven previous events have raised a total of \$4,093.61 for the food pantry, as well as many trailer loads of food items. So please bring a food item, check made payable to the Union Food Pantry, or cash to donate. This is not required to participate in the electronic recycling event.
- HOW HAS THESE EVENTS IMPACTED OUR ENVIRONMENT? The seven past events have diverted 203,767 pounds of materials from the waste stream for recycling. Also, these events provide work for the employees at the Midwest Recycling Center in the St. Louis region.

- ✓ Use an anti-theft device




The Union Police Department supervisors selected Patrolman John Monroe as the 2014 Officer of the Year.

We at the City of Union are excited about the addition of the Veterans Memorial Park to our park system. The planning and design of the park has been in the works for years, and finally, ground has been broken, initial grading completed and construction of the amenities is scheduled to begin in June 2015.

Parks are a vital component of a vibrant community, improving the quality of life for residents and visitors alike. Not only do they add to the physical quality of communities with the aesthetic and environmental value they provide, they offer

residents a place to gather, and they play a vital role in promoting the recreational health of a community.

Veterans Memorial Park is an approximately 43.8 acre park, located on the east side of Union, approximately 1/2 mile south of Highway 50 along Progress Parkway. The site is large enough to accommodate several sports fields, as well as natural green space and playgrounds.

This new park will have many uses and amenities and serve residents and visi-

tors of all ages and varied interests.

For the sports enthusiasts, it will entail at least 5 baseball/softball fields and 3 soccer/football fields. Restrooms and concession stands are conveniently located to the fields.

For the young, and young at heart, a splashpad with ground sprays and other water features is planned. An exciting new feature is the amphitheater with seating for 200-300 people. The amphitheater will be a perfect place for family concerts, movies under the stars and a venue for other outdoor entertainment. In addition, there is a plan for a concession stand, restrooms, and a meeting room to accommodate 20-30 people.

A one-mile walking path with strate-gically placed exercise stations will meander around the park, allowing users to build strength and flexibility, while working on their cardio. The park also offers plenty of space for relaxing and enjoying nature, with two fishing ponds and a natural eco-friendly landscape design, retaining much of the area's woodlands and meadows.

The park will include 3 large pavilions that may be rented for special events, as well as smaller casual shelters for family style picnics. Additionally, plans include 3 playgrounds strategically placed throughout the park. These playgrounds will feature the latest in design and fitness.

Veteran's Memorial Park, with all of its' features and amenities, will in no way replace our current use of ball fields and our other parks and amenities. Union is the fastest growing City in Franklin County, and this new park will support that growth.
